

Exploring the Word of God from the Other Side Feast of the Baptism of the Lord

Reading 1

Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7

Thus says the LORD:

*Here is my servant whom I uphold,
my chosen one with whom I am pleased,
upon whom I have put my spirit; he shall bring
forth justice to the nations, not crying out, not
shouting, not making his voice heard in the
street. a bruised reed he shall not break, and a
smoldering wick he shall not quench, until he
establishes justice on the earth; the coastlands
will wait for his teaching.*

*I, the LORD, have called you for the victory of
justice, I have grasped you by the hand; I
formed you, and set you as a covenant of the
people, a light for the nations, to open the eyes
of the blind, to bring out prisoners from con-
finement, and from the dungeon, those who
live in darkness.*

I really can't figure out why so many of us are fearful of dying! The above words are for and about US! WE are the Lord's servants! In baptism, God's very spirit is put within us with the pouring of the water and the anointings with oil! Each and every one of us has been called "for the victory of justice"!

The Jews of the Old Testament accepted this—and so must we. Last Sunday, the Feast of the Epiphany, the Magi "didn't make it"! None of us knew where the Three Kings "live" during the other weeks of the year....so, I suggested at the 11:15 Mass (at St. Peter the Apostle Church in Joplin) that we simply agree to "be" the Epiphany in our homes and places of work and play! Later on Sunday afternoon, a family that I take communion to and I fleshed this out in terms of some people we know who are somewhat "lost". Our question to ourselves: HOW COULD WE BECOME THE EPIPHANY FOR THEM?

We had a wonderful NON-JUDGMENTAL sharing session! We recognized that WE are the BRUISED REED also...we need to experience the EPIPHANY if we have any hope of

sharing it with another. And the experience begins with realizing that God's world is fused with this world through our baptism.

Years ago when I was a hospital chaplain in Methodist Hospital in San Antonio I was called to the neo-natal unit to baptize a little baby girl who was in difficulty. A Styrofoam cup held the tap water; the family was gathered around; I held the baby. When I said, "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit", *I was so touched and blessed.* I had letters from the mother of the baby for several weeks after they went home. Her baby was always going to be "special" because of the post-birth difficulties--but, to use the title of a movie that is special to me: she was "More Beautiful for Having Been Broken."

Each of us is "broken"! But the water poured at baptism somehow ERASES that brokenness—and God sees only "wholeness." Let's "give ourselves a break" and embrace what GOD SEES in ourselves and in one another! Maybe we'll act WHOLE, too!

*I hope that 2021 will be a better year
for all of us!*
