Exploring the Word of God from the "Other Side" Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading 1

2 Kings 4:8-11, 14-16a

One day Elisha came to Shunem, where there was a woman of influence, who urged him to dine with her. Afterward, whenever he passed by, he used to stop there to dine. So she said to her husband, "I know that Elisha is a holy man of God. Since he visits us often, let us arrange a little room on the roof and furnish it for him with a bed, table, chair, and lamp, so that when he comes to us he can stay there." Sometime later Elisha arrived and stayed in the room overnight.

Later Elisha asked, "Can something be done for her?" His servant Gehazi answered, "Yes! She has no son, and her husband is getting on in years." Elisha said, "Call her." When the woman had been called and stood at the door, Elisha promised, "This time next year you will be fondling a baby son."



Chapter 4 and following in 2 Kings holds the stories of Elisha, the prophet who succeeded Elijah. The stories tell of cures and "testings" and amazing experiences and unusual events. Elijah even brings the boy whom the barren mother birthed back to life!

In the time of this pandemic, as I write this particular column, our area of southwest Missouri has had a severe spike in COVID-19 cases. Would that we, too, had an Elisha living in our midst! But alas; we do not.

Therefore, it is *our* duty to be a responsible prophet! We owe it to one another to distance ourselves; we owe it to one another to wear the mask that nearly melts off our face as we breathe; we owe it to one another to be careful and caring.

When Elisha the Prophet was called to the home of the mother of the boy who had died, he came immediately and, as the story goes, "he laid atop the body of the child", covering the dead body with his own. That gesture brought the boy back to life.

Our task is the opposite: no matter how hard it is, we simply must *keep our distance*. In keeping the recommended distance, **WE GIVE GOD ROOM TO WORK AMONG US!**

I, too, am very tired of this protocol that we are under. But, if I were "out and about" all the time, I would ALWAYS wear a mask; I would keep a safe distance; I would take care of both you and me!

I need to get more serious about this! Do you? Mea Culpa!!!!

The hero operates off his own agenda, whereas the knight is under someone else's agenda. The knight lays his or her sword at the foot of the King or Queen. The knight, like Jesus, "does nothing on his own".

Jesus came into this world precisely as a savior, to vanquish the powers of darkness, violence, injustice, Satan, and death. But notice how, almost as mantra, he keeps saying: I do nothing on my own. I am perfectly obedient to my Father.

Jesus was never a hero, a "lone-ranger" doing his own thing while barely concealing a smug superiority. He was the paradigm of the "knight", the humble foot-soldier who always lays his sword at the foot of the King. (Ron Rolheiser, OMI, June 19, 2020)
